

Seequent hosts South African High Commissioner at Christchurch HQ to celebrate strong relationship

Global technology company Seequent (formerly ARANZ Geo) hosted the South African High Commissioner Zodwa Lallie at their Christchurch-based headquarters on 13 December 2017. The visit was designed to celebrate and further strengthen the company's relationship with South Africa.
