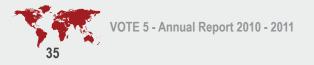

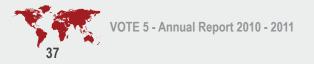

Abuja: The funds were not spent due to delay in handing over the chancery to the Department. Refer to page 4-5 in the Accounting Officer's report.



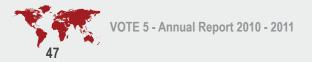
